#1397 Bond ordinance to authorize the resurfacing of various roads in, by and for the Borough of Bogota, in the County of Bergen, New Jersey, to appropriate the sum of \$150,000 to pay the cost thereof, to make a down payment, to authorize the issuance of bonds to finance such appropriation and to provide for the issuance of bond anticipation notes in anticipation of the issuance of such bonds. #1398 Bond ordinance to authorize roadway and intersection improvements at various locations in, by and for the Borough of Bogota, in the County of Bergen, State of New Jersey, to appropriate the sum of \$525,000 to pay the cost thereof, to authorize the issuance of bonds to finance such appropriation and to provide for the issuance of bond anticipation notes in anticipation of the issuance of such bonds. The voting record is attached.

#1399 Calendar year 2011 ordinance to exceed the municipal budget cost of living allowance and to establish a CAP Bank Auditor Haag explained the CAP, stating the budget is limited up to 3.5% - voting record is attached.

#1401 Bond ordinance to amend Section 4.A or the bond ordinance (ord. #1388) entitled "bond ordinance to authorize the making of various public improvements and the acquisition of new communication and signal systems equipment and a new automotive vehicle, including original apparatus and equipment, in, by and for the Borough of Bogota , in the County of Bergen, State of New Jersey, to appropriate the sum of \$274,000 to pay the cost thereof, to make a down payment, to authorize the issuance of bonds to finance such appropriation and to provide for the issuance of bond anticipation notes in anticipation of the issuance of such bonds" adopted October 21, 2010.
