### TITLE OF ORDINANCE

# BOROUGH OF BOGOTA BERGEN COUNTY, NEW JERSEY CALENDAR YEAR 2024 ORDINANCE TO EXCEED THE MUNICIPAL BUDGET COST OF LIVING ALLOWANCE AND TO ESTABLISH A CAP BANK (N.J.S.A. 40A-4-45.14)

WHEREAS, the Local Government Cap Law, N.J.S. 40A:4-45.1 et seq., provides that in the preparation of its annual budget, a municipality shall limit any increase in said budget up to 2.5% unless authorized by ordinance to increase it to 3.5% over the previous year's final appropriations, subject to certain exceptions; and,

**WHEREAS**, N.J.S.A. 40A:4-45.15a provides that a municipality may, when authorized by ordinance, appropriate the difference between the amount of its actual final appropriation and the 3.5% percentage rate as an exception to its final appropriations in either of the next two succeeding years; and,

WHEREAS, the Governing Body of the Borough of Bogota in the County of Bergen finds it advisable and necessary to increase its CY 2024 budget by up to 3.5% over the previous year's final appropriations, in the interest of promoting the health, safety and welfare of the citizens; and,

WHEREAS, the Governing Body hereby determines that a 1% increase in the budget of said year, amounting to \$92,790 in excess of the increase in final appropriations otherwise permitted by the Local Government Cap Law, is advisable and necessary; and,

WHEREAS, the Governing Body hereby determines that any amount authorized hereinabove that is not appropriated as part of the final budget shall be retained as an exception to final appropriation in either of the next two succeeding years.

**NOW, THEREFORE BE IT ORDAINED**, by the Governing Body of the Borough of Bogota in the County of Bergen, a majority of the full authorized membership of this governing body affirmatively concurring, that, in the CY 2024 budget year, the final appropriations of the Borough of Bogota shall, in accordance with this ordinance and N.J.S.A. 40A:4-45.14, be increased by up

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to 3.5%, amounting to \$324,765, and that the CY 2024 municipal budget for the Borough of Bogota be approved and adopted in accordance with this ordinance; and,

**BE IT FURTHER ORDAINED**, that any amount authorized hereinabove that is not appropriated as part of the final budget shall be retained as an exception to final appropriation in either of the next two succeeding years; and,

**BE IT FURTHER ORDAINED**, that a certified copy of this ordinance as introduced be filed with the Director of the Division of Local Government Services within 5 days of introduction; and,

**BE IT FURTHER ORDAINED**, that a certified copy of this ordinance upon adoption, with the recorded vote included thereon, be filed with said Director within 5 days after such adoption.

# **NEW JERSEY 2010 LOCAL UNIT LEVY CAP LAW**

P.L. 2007, c. 62, was amended by P.L. 2008 c. 6 and P.L. 2010 c. 44 (S-29 R1). The last amendment reduces the 4% to 2% and modifies some of the exceptions and exclusions. It also removes the LFB waiver. The voter referendum now requires a vote in excess of only 50% which is reduced from the original 60% in P.L. 2007, c. 62.

# BY-LAWS OF THE COUNCIL OF THE BOROUGH OF BOGOTA

# 2024

Revised January 17, 2019 Revised February 17, 2023 Approved March 2, 2023 Revised March 21, 2024 Approved March 21, 2024 Revised May 2, 2024- Pending

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# **ARTICLE I**

The deliberation of the Council shall be governed by Robert's Rules of Order, except when the same are in conflict with the laws of the State of New Jersey or these By-Laws, in which event, said Robert's Rules of Order shall be inapplicable.

#### **ARTICLE II**

## Section 1

The Mayor shall preside over the deliberations of the Council and shall conduct the meetings thereof. He/She shall also participate in the determination of Borough affairs to the extent permitted by statute.

## **Section 2**

The Mayor shall, on all occasions, preserve order and decorum, and he/she shall cause the removal of all persons who interrupt the orderly proceedings of the Council.

## **Section 3**

When two or more Councilmembers shall request recognition at the same time, the Mayor shall name the one entitled to the floor.

#### Section 4

The Mayor shall decide all questions of order without debate, subject to an appeal by the Borough Attorney whose determination shall be binding, and the Mayor may call upon the Borough Attorney for his/her opinion upon any question of order.

# Section 5

The Mayor shall be an ex-officio member of all committees, both standing and special, and shall be informed in advance of all meetings of such committees.

#### Section 6

In the absence of the Mayor, or if he/she is unable to perform his/her duties; the Council President or, in his/her inability to act, the Councilmember, having the longest, continuous and uninterrupted term of service, shall act as Presiding Officer, as provided by statute.

# **Section 7**

The Mayor shall not vote except to give the deciding vote in case of a tie, or as otherwise provided by the laws of the State of New Jersey.

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# **ARTICLE III Borough Clerk**

## Section 1

The Borough Clerk shall attend all meetings of the Council, keep a record of its proceedings and perform such other duties enjoined upon that office by the laws of the State of NJ and these By-Laws.

## **Section 2**

The Borough Clerk shall keep the minutes and ordinance books properly and fully indexed and up-to-date, and shall perform all the duties evolving upon such office and such special services as the Mayor, and Council may require.

## Section 3

It shall not be necessary for the Borough Clerk to read the minutes of the previous meeting, if the said Borough Clerk shall have submitted an electronic draft copy to each of the Councilmembers, as soon as practicable.

## **Section 4**

Mayor and Council may submit edits to the draft meeting minutes in writing or verbally to the Clerk prior to the approval of the minutes.

# Section 5

The Borough Clerk shall make available the final agenda and all supporting documents, including resolutions, of the Mayor and Council meeting by noon on the Tuesday prior to the meeting. Any items added after 5:00 p.m. on that date shall be added to the next meeting agenda, unless it is an emergency where action is required.

Items may be added to the agenda by the Borough Clerk, Borough CFO or Borough \*\*\*\* Administrator, in addition to the Mayor and two Councilmembers or three Councilmembers.

Items may be removed from the agenda by the Mayor and two Councilmembers, or by three Councilmembers, prior to the meeting that the agenda relates to.

# ARTICLE IV Work Session and Meetings

## Section 1

The Council shall hold an annual re-organization meeting during the first seven (7) days of January of any year, which meeting shall be the first meeting of the year and will be held within the Borough at such time and place as the Council may direct.

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All regular meetings of the Borough shall take place at 7:30p.m. on the first and third Thursdays of each month. Special or emergency meetings may be called from time to time by the Mayor or by any four members of the Council upon consultation with the Borough Clerk, Borough Attorney and/or Borough Administrator.

# **Section 2**

The Council, at its annual reorganization meeting shall, by the vote of a majority, of said Council, elect from their members, a President of the Council. He/She shall hold office for one (1) year and until the next annual reorganization meeting. If the Council, at its annual reorganization meeting, fails to elect a President from the Council, the Mayor may appoint the President from the Council, and in such case no confirmation by the Council shall be necessary.

## **Section 3**

If the Mayor is absent from the Borough for a period of three (3) days or, for any reason is unable to act, the President of the Council shall perform all the duties of the Mayor during such absence or inability. The Mayor, in case of his/her intended absence from the Borough for more than three (3) days at any time shall notify the President in writing of such intended absence, whereupon the President shall be acting Mayor, upon the receipt of such notice and continue to act in that capacity until the Mayor's return,

# **Section 4**

If a Councilmember shall be absent from the Borough for more than three (3) days, he/she shall so notify the Mayor and Council President.

## **Section 5**

At the annual reorganization meeting, the Council shall fix the time and place for holding regular meetings during the ensuing year, which time and place, shall not be changed; except by proper notification in accordance with the Open Public Meetings Law and amendment of the Bylaws.

#### Section 6

It shall be the duty of the Mayor, when necessary, to call special meetings of the Council. In case of his/her neglect or refusal, any four (4) members of the Council may call such meetings at such time and place in such Borough as they may designate. In all cases except those of urgency and importance, at least forty-eight (48) hour notice shall be given to the Mayor and Councilmembers by the Borough Clerk in advance of a special meeting, which shall be conducted in accordance of the New Jersey Open Public Meetings Act. Said notice shall include the time, date, and place of the special meeting and shall include the purpose of the meeting.

# **Section 7**

Three (3) Councilmembers and the Mayor, or in the absence of the Mayor, four (4) Councilmembers shall constitute a quorum.

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#### Section 8

If no quorum is present at any meeting within fifteen minutes of the advertised start time, those assembled shall have power and are authorized to set a new meeting date; and then adjourn.

The following order of business shall be observed:

Consent agenda including all various approvals, minutes and payment of claims

Reports including Committee Liaisons, Borough Administrator, Borough Clerk, Borough

Attorney and Engineer

**Closed Session** 

Adjournment

# **Work Session**

Work Sessions shall be held on the 1<sup>st</sup> Thursday of the month

Only one Citizen Remark shall be held during a Work Session, and shall be conducted at the end of the meeting

No Work Session shall be held in the months of July, August, and November

Regular meetings of the Mayor and Council shall be called to order at 7:30 pm. Special meetings shall be called to order at the designated date and time.

Meetings shall end at 10:30 pm, with a voice vote being taken at 10:30pm to extend the meeting by thirty minutes increments with the majority vote of the Council.

#### Section 10

The regular order of business may be suspended at any meeting by a majority vote of Council present or by the Mayor with the consent of Council.

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## Section 11

All actions of the Council shall be by a majority vote of those present, except as otherwise required by NJ statutes.

# **Section 12**

Rules of Order

- a) Every member, when speaking, shall address himself/herself to the Chair unless directed otherwise.
- b) While a member is speaking, no other member shall entertain any private discourse. No member of Council shall leave his/her seat without permission of the Chair.
- c) Every member who shall be present, when a question is put, shall vote for or against it, unless he/she shall abstain for any reason.
- d) No person, not a member of the governing body, shall be given the privilege of the floor except by permission of the Mayor or upon the demand of a member of the Council, if supported by the votes of a majority of the Councilmembers present.
- e) A member called to order by the Mayor or Presiding Officer, shall cease speaking immediately unless permitted to explain. He/She may, if he/she wishes, appeal to the Borough Attorney for permission to continue his/her remarks, whose determination shall be binding. If there is no appeal, the decision of the Chair shall stand and be final.
- f) No resolution or motion shall be put for a vote unless seconded.
- g) When a motion is made and seconded, there must be a call for discussion on the resolution prior to the roll call vote.
- h) A motion to lay on the table shall be decided without amendment or debate; and such motion, until it is decided, shall preclude all amendments or debate of the main question.
- i) A motion to adjourn shall be decided without debate and shall always be in order, except when the Council is voting or when a Council person is addressing the Council, or immediately after the question of adjournment has been decided in the negative.
- j) A consent agenda may be used by unanimous agreement of Council.
- k) Items on the consent agenda can be pulled for discussion at any time at the request of the Mayor or a Council Member.
- l) The Mayor and Council Members are prohibited from sending or receiving text messages with other members on the dais until the meeting is adjourned.

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# The following sections are proposed to be added to Article IV (Meetings)

## **Section 13**

The Council may, in its discretion, hold their public meetings in-person and remote (i.e. hybrid) format, provided the Open Public Meetings Act, N.J.S.A. 10:4-1, *et seq* and other applicable laws are followed. Remote meetings shall only be mandatory in the event of a public health or other declared emergency that requires meetings to be held remotely, because the emergency reasonably prevents the local public body from safely conducting public business at a physical location with members of the public present.

A. When a meeting is conducted in a hybrid manner, the public accessing the meeting remotely shall have similar access to participate in the meeting as members of the public who are present, and shall be limited to speaking during public comments and other public hearings for no more than 5 minutes per person.

- B. The option of hybrid meetings is a convenience to the public. Therefore, unless a declared emergency makes conducting a remote meeting mandatory, Council members, the Borough Attorney, Borough Administrator and Borough Clerk are required to attend all public meetings in person unless their absence is excused.
- C. Any agendas or presentation documents that would be viewed or made available to members of the public who physically attend a public meeting shall also be made visible on a video broadcast or be made available for download on the Borough's website ahead of the meeting.
- D. The electronic communication technology used for a hybrid or remote public meetings must have a function that allows the Borough to mute the audio of all members of the public, as well as allow members on the dais to mute themselves.

If a member of the public accessing the meeting remotely becomes disruptive, including during any period for public comment, the person charged with running the remote component of the public meeting shall mute or continue muting the disruptive person, at the direction of the Mayor or a majority vote of the Council, after the person is warned that continued disruption may result in their being prevented from speaking. Disruptive conduct includes sustained inappropriate behaviors such as, but not necessarily limited to, shouting, interruption and use of profanity.

E. All public notices to a hybrid meeting must include the instructions to access the meeting remotely, and indicate where meeting documents, such as agendas, will be made available for download. Connection instructions shall also be posted on the Borough's webpage ahead of the meeting. If the Borough Council intends to conduct hybrid meetings for a series of regularly

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scheduled meetings, then the annual meeting notice shall be revised at least seven (7) days prior to the next regularly scheduled hybrid meeting in accordance with this sub-part. If a declared emergency requires public meetings to be conducted remotely, then a copy of the public notice shall also be posted on the door of the Municipal Building. The notice must be viewable from the outside.

F. If members of the public who are remotely accessing the meeting become unable to gain access due to a technical or equipment issue experienced by the Borough, then no official action should be taken at the meeting until the connection for remote users is restored. If the technical issues are not resolved within fifteen (15) minutes, then the meeting shall be adjourned.

# ARTICLE V Committees/Liaisons

## Section 1

There shall be the following standing committees, with 2 Council liaisons appointed to each by the Mayor under the consent of the Council;

- 1. Administration/Personnel
- 2. Finance and Tax/Grant Writing
- 3. Board of Education
- 4. BACSA
- 5. Buildings & Grounds/Property Maintenance
- 6. Construction/Planning and Zoning
- 7. Department of Public Works
- 8. Environmental/Shade Tree
- 9. Fire Department
- 10. Health and Insurance Board of Health
- 11. Library
- 12. Liaison to the County/State
- 13. Police/Auxiliary Police/Court/ Office of Emergency Management
- 14. Recreation
- 15. Rescue
- 16. Senior Citizens
- 17. Transportation (Airport Noise Abatement, Train Issues, etc.)
- 18. Veterans' Affairs

Notwithstanding the foregoing, there shall be a police committee consisting of three council liaisons whose members and chairperson shall be appointed by the Mayor.

# **Section 2**

Liaisons may meet with various departments, boards and commissions and report back to and/or make recommendations to the full Council, but may not make any financial commitments nor act outside of any statutory limitations established by the State of New Jersey.

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#### Section 3

The Mayor may appoint Special Committees with Council consent for purposes other than those embraced in the Standing Committees, designated in Section 1.

# **Section 4**

The Chairperson of each Standing or Special committee shall be prepared to report to the Mayor and Council at each regular meeting on principal activities and, achievements of their respective committee.

# **ARTICLE VI Ordinances**

All ordinances shall be submitted in writing, with approval as to form by Borough Attorney at a meeting of the Council. The procedure for passage of all ordinances shall conform to the procedure under the Laws of the State of New Jersey. After final passage or adoption of any ordinance, it shall be published as provided by law, together with date of passage.

# ARTICLE VII Payment of Claims

## Section 1

All bills or claims against the Borough shall be in writing, fully itemized, sworn to as required by statute, and presented on such forms as the Borough shall provide for such purpose. No bills or claims shall be approved by the Borough Council for final payments unless the same shall have been reviewed by the appropriate Council members prior to the regular meeting at which payment is approved. The bill list will be provided to all Council members with the Agenda by noon of the Tuesday preceding the Council meeting.

# **Section 2**

All bills and claims must be supported by a certification that the goods were received in good order, or that the services were satisfactorily rendered, and that the same are in accordance with the agreed specifications and price. Such certification shall be made by the responsible person accepting the same on behalf of the Borough, and who may be held accountable. Each such bill or claim shall then be carefully reviewed, checked, and approved for budget change and classification by or under direction of the Borough official or department head responsible for the budget item affected.

All checked Purchase Orders, with supporting papers attached, shall then be presented to the Finance Committee for examination and audit.

All Purchase Orders, so approved, shall be referred back to the Borough Clerk to be presented at a regular meeting of the Mayor and Council for approval. (Payment of Claims)

Authorization to pay amounts of the approved PO shall be by resolution of the

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#### Council.

All bills, Purchase Orders and Bank Statements shall be filed in a safe place and be made available for public inspection.

# **ARTICLE VIII Borough Seal**

## Section 1

The seal of the Borough shall be as hereinafter impressed.

# **Section 2**

The seal shall be Circular in form and contain the following; "The Borough of Bogota, Bergen County, New Jersey", including thereinafter year of incorporation.

#### Section 3

The seal shall be in the custody of the Borough. Clerk and shall be impressed on all appropriate documents or papers.

# ARTICLE IX **Amendments**

## **Section 1**

The Mayor or any member of the Council may propose amendments to these By-Laws at any regular meeting.

# Section 2

These By-Laws shall be altered or amended only by a majority vote of the entire Council on a roll call vote.

# **ARTICLE X Adoption and Term**

# **Section 1**

The By-Laws shall be adopted by a resolution of Council concurred in by a majority of Council.

# **Section 2**

The By-Laws shall become effective immediately after adoption and shall remain in effect until Council amends same.

WHEREAS, P.L. 2021, c. 16, entitled "An Act concerning the regulation and use of cannabis, and amending and supplementing various parts of the statutory law" was approved on February 22, 2021; and

WHEREAS, said Act enacted N.J.S.A. 24:6I-31 et seq. entitled the "New Jersey Cannabis Regulatory, Enforcement Assistance, and Marketplace Modernization Act;" and

WHEREAS, under the Act, every municipality would have the option to authorize and regulate, in a manner consistent with the Act's regulation of cannabis businesses, the number of licensed businesses, as well as their location, manner, and times of operation within its jurisdiction; however, the time of operation of delivery services would be subject only to regulation by the commission; and

WHEREAS, pursuant to said Act, the Township of Teaneck adopted Ordinance No 57-2021 "Permitting Cannabis Establishments as a Conditional Use Within the Light Industry District in the Township of Teaneck"; and

WHEREAS, the Township Council wishes to amend said ordinance.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT ORDAINED by the Township Council of the Township of Teaneck, Bergen County, New Jersey, as follows:

SECTION 1. Article V, Section 33-26, Prohibited uses, of Article V, Zoning Ordinance, of Chapter 33, Development Regulations, of the Code of the Township of Teaneck is hereby amended as shown below by deletion (strikethrough) as follows:

(d) Cannabis distributors, cannabis testing facilities and cannabis establishments, including a cannabis cultivator, a cannabis manufacturer, a cannabis wholesaler, a cannabis retailer, and a cannabis delivery service, except for the delivery of cannabis items and related supplies by a delivery service,, as those terms are defined in N.J.S.A. 24:6I-33, and for the dispensing of prescription medical cannabis or marijuana by licensed physicians and pharmacists, are hereby prohibited in all districts, except as otherwise specifically permitted herein.

SECTION 2. Appendix III, Fees and Charges for Certain Township Services, of Chapter 2, Charter/Administrative Code, of the Code of the Township of Teaneck is hereby amended and supplemented as shown below by addition (underline) and deletion (strikethrough) as follows:

### **BUILDING DEPARTMENT**

SECTION 3. Chapter 11B, Cannabis and Cannabis Transfer Tax, of the Code of the Township of Teaneck is hereby amended and supplemented as shown below by addition (underline) and deletion (strikethrough) as follows:

### Sec. 11B-2 License required

In addition to any license issued by the State, cannabis distributors, cannabis testing facilities and cannabis establishments within the Township of Teaneck shall be required to obtain from the Building Department an annual license evidencing compliance with the requirements of this ordinance. The license shall be for a one year period commencing July 1st of the year in which it is issued and expiring June 30th of the following year. In the event of any violation of this Ordinance, the Building Department may, upon notice to and a hearing provided to the licensee, revoke the license. The annual fee for the license for a cannabis distributor, cannabis testing facility or cannabis establishment shall be set forth in Appendix III of Chapter 2 of the Teaneck Township Code.

## Sec. 11B-2 Application for Local License

a. Application for Local License. Persons wishing to obtain any cannabis license within the Township shall file a license application with the Township Clerk, on a standardized form established by the Township Clerk and available in the Township Clerk's office or other suitable locations as determined by the official. The Township Clerk shall establish a reasonable application period and deadline for all applications. An application shall be deemed incomplete, and shall not be processed by the Township Clerk, until all documents and

application fees are submitted. To be deemed complete, all applications shall be submitted to the Township Administrator's Office and shall be accompanied by the items referenced below. The following regulations shall apply:

- 1. The applicant shall submit proof that the applicant has or will have lawful possession of the premises proposed for the cannabis establishment, which proof may consist of: a deed, a lease, a real estate contract contingent upon successful licensing, or a binding letter of intent by the owner of the premises indicating an intent to lease the premises to the entrant contingent upon successful licensing. The applicant shall submit a letter from the appropriate zoning official indicating that the location proposed for licensing by the applicant complies with all applicable Township zoning laws and the location restrictions set forth herein.
- 2. The applicant shall submit an affidavit and documentary proof of compliance with all State and local laws regarding affirmative action, anti-discrimination and fair employment practices. The applicant shall also certify under oath that they will not and shall not discriminate based on race, color, religion (creed), gender, gender expression, age, national origin (ancestry), disability, marital status, sexual orientation, or military status, in any of its activities or operations.
- 3. The applicant shall submit the required nonrefundable application fee in the amount of \$5,000.
- 4. The applicant and the application shall otherwise comply with any and all qualification standards set forth in the State and Township's laws or regulations.
- 5. Completed applications shall include a business plan outlining the proposed operations of the cannabis business.
- 6. All applications shall be evaluated by the Township Council who shall evaluate all applications as to the issuance of a resolution of support or a rejection of the application. The recommendation shall be made after consideration and evaluation of the following criteria:
  - (a) The applicant's owners' or principals' qualifications and experience operating in highly regulated industries, including cannabis, healthcare, pharmaceutical manufacturing, or retail pharmacies, with preference to experience operating such businesses within the State of New Jersey and where the value of the owners' experience shall outweigh the experience of non-owner principals.
  - (b) The applicant's qualifications and experience related to public safety and security, including any of the applicant's owners' or principals' experience in securing controlled substances or valuable items. Applicant shall submit a summary of the applicant's plans for storage of products and currency, physical security, video surveillance, security personnel, and visitor management as well as training plans.
  - (c) The status of the applicant's control over the premises at the proposed location, and specifically whether the applicant owns or has executed an agreement to lease or

purchase the site.

- (d) The extent of the applicant's ties to the community as measured by residency in Teaneck by employees, managers and/or shareholders, historical operation of a local business, historical ties to Teaneck or area civic organizations and/or charities.
- (e) Any other information that the applicant may wish to highlight and bring to the Township's attention regarding the proposed cannabis business operation and/or the owners, principals or employees of the business.
- 7. The Township Council shall not issue resolutions of support in excess of the number of local cannabis licenses permitted in accordance with the TOWNSHIP OF TEANECK CANNABIS LICENSE AND FEE SCHEDULE. The Township Clerk shall engage with an applicant granted a resolution of support and after all state and municipal approvals have been obtained for a host community benefits agreement which must be approved by the Township Council.
- 8. Notwithstanding the foregoing competitive application process, a notification of a resolution of support shall entitle the recipient applicant to pursue a State license in the appropriate cannabis class for up to eighteen (18) months, which may be extended at the Township Council's discretion for an additional six (6) months for good cause, after a public hearing. No license to operate shall issue until the applicant has received a State annual license and satisfied other prerequisites of municipal licensure. If the recipient of a resolution of support has not received a State license within eighteen (18) months from issuance, unless extended for good cause, and with a public hearing, the Township Clerk shall issue a new request for applications and evaluate all applicants for licensure under the above criteria.

### Sec. 11B-3 Civil Penalty

In accordance with N.J.S.A. 24:6I-45, any person or cannabis distributor, cannabis testing facility or cannabis establishment violating any provision of this ordinance shall be subject to a civil penalty not to exceed the sum of \$4,2000.00 per violation in accordance with the provisions of the "Penalty Enforcement Law of 1999," P.L.1999, c.274 (N.J.S.A.2A:58-10 et seq.). An action to collect such penalty shall be brought in the Municipal Court of the Township of Teaneck and any penalty assessed shall be payable to the Township of Teaneck Summary suspension.

Notwithstanding the foregoing, when the Township Administrator has been notified of a third conviction by a licensee or has reasonable grounds to believe that a licensee has engaged in deliberate and willful violation of any applicable law or regulation, or that the public health, safety, and/or general welfare has been jeopardized and requires immediate action, the Township Clerk may enter a summary suspension order which immediately suspends the licensee's license to operate and schedule a hearing as follows:

- (a) The summary suspension order shall be in writing, shall state the reasons therefor, and shall schedule a hearing not less than ten (10) nor more than thirty (30) days from the date of the order. The order shall be served upon the licensee immediately.
- (b) The Township Clerk shall convene the Mayor and Council to conduct the hearing. The licensee shall be permitted to appear at the hearing, along with counsel, if so desired. The licensee must notify the Township Administrator at least five (5) days prior to the hearing if the licensee plans to bring counsel to the hearing. At the conclusion of the hearing, the Mayor and Council may lift the suspension order and reinstate the license in cases where the licensee has taken sufficient immediate actions to rectify the violation(s) which were the cause of the summary suspension order. Alternatively, the Mayor and Council may impose any fines, conditions, restrictions, suspensions, revocations or combination thereof as warranted.

<u>Inactive licenses</u>. Following the commencement of operations by a cannabis business, the <u>Township Administrator may suspend or revoke any license if the licensed premises has been inactive or unoccupied by the licensee for at least six (6) months.</u>

State license. The Mayor and Council may suspend or revoke any locally-issued license if the corresponding State license for the subject location is expired, surrendered, suspended, or revoked.

Sec. 11B-4 Cannabis Definitions, Prohibitions, Licensed Use and Licensing Authority

Sec. 11B-4.1 Cannabis Definitions.

As used in this article, the following terms shall have the meanings as defined in the "New Jersey Cannabis Regulatory, Enforcement Assistance, and Marketplace Modernization Act," also referenced herein as the "Act" or "P.L. 2021, c. 16," as it may be amended or superseded, and are included herein for purposes of general acknowledgement and ease of use:

Class 1 Cannabis Cultivator license, for facilities involved in growing and cultivating cannabis;

<u>Class 2 Cannabis Manufacturer license</u>, for facilities involved in the manufacturing, preparation, and packaging of cannabis items;

<u>Class 3 Cannabis Wholesaler license</u>, for facilities involved in obtaining and selling cannabis items for later resale by other licensees;

Class 4 Cannabis Distributor license, for businesses involved in transporting cannabis plants in bulk from a licensed cultivator to another licensed cultivator, or cannabis items in bulk from any type of licensed cannabis business to another;

<u>Class 5 Cannabis Retailer license</u>, for locations at which cannabis items and related supplies are sold to consumers; and

Class 6 Cannabis Delivery license, for businesses providing courier services for consumer purchases that are fulfilled by a licensed cannabis retailer in order to make deliveries of the purchases items to a consumer, and which service would include the ability of a consumer to make a purchase directly through the cannabis delivery service which would be presented by the delivery service for fulfillment by a retailer and then delivered to a consumer.

All other terms as defined in the Act are hereby incorporated herein by reference and shall have the meanings set forth in the Act, as may be amended or superseded.

<u>In addition, the following terms shall have the meanings indicated:</u>

"Gifting" shall mean the sale of any object containing cannabis or a cannabis product wherein the cannabis itself is assigned no or a below market price sales price.

"Microbusiness" means the holder of a License to operate as a Cannabis Establishment, Cannabis Distributor or Cannabis Delivery Service with a smaller footprint than a Standard Cannabis Establishment, Cannabis Distributor or Cannabis Delivery Service and which, with respect to its operations, capacity and quantity of product, may only:

- (1) employ no more than 10 employees;
- (2) operate a Cannabis Establishment occupying an area of no more than 2,500 square feet, and in the case of a Cannabis Cultivator grow Cannabis on an area no more than 2,500 square feet measured on a horizontal plane and grow above that plane not higher than 24 feet;
- (3) possess no more than 1,000 Cannabis plants each month, except that a Cannabis Distributor's possession of Cannabis plants for transportation shall not be subject to this limit;
- (4) acquire each month, in the case of a Cannabis Manufacturer, no more than 1,000 pounds of Usable Cannabis;
- (5) acquire for resale each month, in the case of a Cannabis Wholesaler, no more than 1,000 pounds of Usable Cannabis or the equivalent amount in any form of manufactured Cannabis Product or Cannabis Extract, or any combination thereof; and
- (6) acquire for retail sale each month, in the case of a Cannabis Retailer, no more than 1,000 pounds of Usable Cannabis or the equivalent amount in any form of manufactured Cannabis Product or Cannabis Extract, or any combination thereof.

Sec. 11B-4.2 Non-Licensed Cannabis Businesses and Individual Proprietors and Gifting Prohibited.

The cultivation, manufacturing, preparation, packaging, wholesaling, distributing, retailing, delivery and other related enterprise consisting in whole or in part of cannabis growing, harvesting, drying, producing, marketing and selling by non-licensed businesses or individuals is hereby prohibited throughout the Township. No licensed cannabis enterprise and no non-licensed business or individual may undertake the gifting of cannabis in the Township. The Township shall impose a civil penalty for the violation of any of the provisions of this section not to exceed \$2,000 per violation in accordance with the provisions of the Penalty Enforcement Law of 1999, P.L. 1999, c. 274 (N.J.S.A. 2A:58-10 et seq.). An action to collect such penalty shall be brought in the Municipal Court of the Township of Teaneck and any penalty assessed shall be payable to the Township of Teaneck.

## Sec. 11B-4.3 Licensed Use Applicability

The use of any cannabis license shall only be in strict accordance with the land use and location requirements of the Township. Nothing herein shall prohibit a single owner from owning more than one such license, provided such ownership is not prohibited by State statute or rule.

## Sec. 11B-4.4 Local Licensing Authority

- b. The Township Mayor and Council are hereby designated to act as the local licensing authority for the Township for all cannabis businesses within the Township. The Mayor and Council members shall not have contact with applicants outside of a public meeting. The Township Administrator shall act as the receiver of any communications from the State Cannabis Regulatory Commission and shall promptly convey any item of information with regard to the licensing of cannabis businesses by the State or in which State law requires any review or approval by the Township of any action to the Township Council. Items of a ministerial or administrative nature shall be addressed and filed or directed to Township Officials or departments as needed by the Township Administrator.
- c. Under no circumstances shall a local license for a cannabis business issued by the Township Council be effective until or unless the State has issued the requisite licenses to operate such a facility. It is the intent of this article that no cannabis business may lawfully operate in the Township without the issuance of a State license and full regulatory oversight of the cannabis business by the Cannabis Regulatory Commission or other state licensing authority as required by law as well as oversight and issuance of a license by the Township.
- d. <u>Municipal licensing for cannabis businesses shall follow the nomenclature of the "New Jersey Cannabis Regulatory, Enforcement Assistance, and Marketplace Modernization Act" as indicated in the definitions in this article.</u>
- e. <u>Maximum number of licenses and fees. The Township may issue up to and including the following number of licenses which shall require the associated license application and annual renewal fee:</u>

- f. A resolution of support issued by the Mayor and Township Council pursuant to N.J.A.C. 17:30-5.1(g)1 to a cannabis business shall expire within eighteen (18) months. The Township Council may extend the resolution of support at its discretion for an additional six (6) months for good cause.
- g. Host community benefits agreement. All applicants for a license to operate a cannabis business within the Township shall be required to enter into a host community benefits agreement with the Township after all state and local approvals have been obtained establishing the applicant's willing commitment to the community, and in particular the surrounding neighborhoods, and its support for, by example, local cannabis education programs, local employment and jobs training, enhanced neighborhood security, public safety programs, the Special Improvement District (SID), social services and welfare programs, or other mutually beneficial community investments.
- h. Inspections. Subject to the requirements and limitations of state law, the municipality shall have the reasonable right to inspect the premises of any approved cannabis establishment during its regular hours of operation to ensure compliance with local ordinances and regulations. It shall be unlawful for any cannabis business to refuse to allow such inspection or to hinder such an inspection.

### Sec. 11B-4.5 Term of License and License Renewals; Annual License Fee.

- A. Any local cannabis license issued pursuant to this Chapter shall be valid for a period of one year, beginning on January 1 in each year. At the time of licensure, the applicant shall pay an annual \$10,000.00 license fee. The microbusiness applicant shall pay an annual fee in the amount of \$5,000. The amount of the fee may be modified from time to time by a subsequent duly adopted resolution of the Township Council.
- B. The Township Administrator may, at his/her discretion, adjust the annual renewal date of the local license to correlate with an applicant's State licensing and renewal schedule.
- C. Upon renewal of a license, the licensee shall be governed by any amendments, additional restrictions, or changes in requirements adopted since the previous license was issued or renewed.
- D. Change of location of any license, or modification to expand a licensed premises shall be treated as a new application, subject to Mayor and Council and Municipal Land use review and approval.
- E. Any local cannabis license issued pursuant to this Chapter is nontransferable and shall automatically expire upon transfer.

F. Except where the Township has received a complete renewal application along with the requisite fees and has issued a license renewal, it shall be unlawful for any person to manufacture, sell, distribute, transfer, transport, or otherwise remove cannabis or cannabis products from the premises of any licensee after the expiration date recorded on the face of the license.

## Sec. 11B-4.6 Compliance with Law

A Cannabis Establishment shall comply with all applicable state and local laws and regulations.

- 1. Denial, Revocation or Suspension of License. Appeal Process.
- A. The Township Administrator, in consultation with the Mayor and Township Council, shall suspend or revoke any license if the corresponding State license for the subject location is expired, surrendered, suspended, or revoked.
- B. Where it is found that a licensee has engaged in a deliberate and willful violation of any applicable law or regulation, or that the public health, safety, and/or general welfare has been jeopardized and requires emergency action, the Township Administrator, after consulting with the Committee, is authorized and empowered to immediately suspend any license or permit issued pursuant to this Chapter and order that the licensee cease all operations until such time as the violations are abated.
- C. Any person aggrieved by the action of the Mayor and Council in the denial of a recommendation, any person aggrieved by the action of the Township Administrator in the denial of a local license or the decision with reference to the revocation or suspension of a license in accordance with this Chapter, shall have the right of appeal to the Mayor and Council. Such appeal shall be taken by filing with the Township Administrator, within 20 days of the action complained of a written statement setting forth fully the grounds for the appeal. The Mayor and Council may decide the matter on the papers or schedule a time and place for a hearing on such appeal. Notice of any such hearing shall be served upon the applicant/licensee (whichever is appropriate) or mailed, postage prepaid, to the applicant/licensee at the address given on the application for license in accordance with this Chapter, at least five days prior to the date set for said hearing. The decision and order of the Mayor and Council, on such appeal shall be final and conclusive. The appeal filing fee is \$2500.
- 2. Public Nuisance Declared. Operation of any prohibited or unpermitted cannabis business operation within the municipality in violation of the provisions of this Chapter is hereby declared a public nuisance and shall be abated pursuant to all available remedies.
- 3. Prohibition of Unregulated Sale of Cannabis.
- A. No person shall sell cannabis in the Township without a state cannabis license and a local cannabis license and shall be abated pursuant to all available remedies.
- B. No person shall gift cannabis in the Township as part of a sale of another item or items and shall be abated pursuant to all available remedies. Gifting is the knowing circumvention of

the state's cannabis laws by "gifting" cannabis in exchange for non-cannabis-related purchases such as overpriced cookies, brownies, jars, stickers and many other items.

SECTION 4. Inconsistency. All ordinances or portions thereof, inconsistent with the provisions hereof, are hereby repealed to the extent of such inconsistency.

SECTION 5. Severability. If any section, sentence, clause or other portion of this ordinance, or the application thereof to any person or circumstance, is adjudged by a court of competent jurisdiction to be unconstitutional or otherwise to be invalid, such judgment shall not affect, impair or repeal the remainder of this ordinance.

SECTION 6. Effective Date. This ordinance shall take effect twenty (20) days following passage and publication, as required by law, and upon the filing of a copy with the Planning Board of the County of Bergen.
