Minutes of the Borough of Bogota Mayor and Council meeting held on this date June 29, 2022 in the Borough Hall, 375 Larch Ave, Bogota, New Jersey at 7:30 P.M

The adequate notice for this meeting's time, date, location, and agenda fulfill the "Open Public Meeting Act," P.L.1975, c. 231, requirements.

Also in attendance were Borough Administrator Hynes, Borough Attorney Betesh, and Acting Clerk Flores-Bolivard.

Mayor Kelemen - Welcomed everyone and asked Council President Murphy to lead the attendees in the Pledge of Allegiance.

Councilwoman Carpenter motioned to go into citizen remarks, seconded by Councilman Robbins. All council members present voted yes.

Citizen Remarks: One (5) minute time limit per person.

Ms. Youla- Thanked the Mayor and Council for the sign regarding the illegal dumping of garbage at the DPW HQ that states “NO Dumping”.

Councilman Robbins motioned to close Citizen Remarks, seconded by Councilman Connors; All council members present voted yes.

Councilwoman Carpenter - Addressed the comments from Ms. Youla by saying the NO Dumping sign also has the ordinance affixed to the Sign. The Sign will put people on notice and facilitate the task of the Code Enforcement Officer when the summonses are issued. Camera installations in the area are in progress.

Discussion:

Purchase of cameras at the DPW – The Council discussed how important it is to have security camera surveillance at the DPW HQ and at the Recycling Center location and Administrator Hynes is looking into a package agreement. He also explained that the telecommunications engineer from Johnson Communications visited both sites that have seen a plague of unauthorized dumping.

Bogota Youth Club – Councilman Connors proposed that the funds not used for the Memorial Day Parade be used by the Youth Club program. He expressed the program's benefit to the community. Council President Murphy recommends that the Borough of Bogota host the program on one of its schools' premises instead of the St. Joseph's Church. The Council made recommendations and adopted a resolution to use the remaining funds from the Memorial Day Parade for the Youth Club program. Councilman Connors also requested redirecting money that was set aside for the Police Youth Academy that was not spent.

Parking lot property 231 Railroad Avenue which Bogota has been leasing from Conrail- Councilman Robbins spoke regarding the parking lot property at 231 Railroad Avenue, which Bogota has been leasing from Conrail (now CSX) since 1995. He explained that due to recent inquiries about the property directly across the street, CSX would like to know if the Borough is keeping the property or giving it back. Consensus was to keep it.

Council President Murphy recommended that Borough Attorney Betesh look into any legal matters before making a decision.

Councilwoman Carpenter motioned to accept Consent Agenda Items, seconded by Councilman Connors; all council members present voted yes.

Councilwoman Carpenter, Councilman Connors, Council President Murphy, Councilman Robbins, and Councilwoman voted yes. Councilwoman Fede abstained from paying Tom's Service Station's bill.

Discussions on Resolution to be voted on separately:

2022-114 Appoint Community Development Representatives- Councilwoman Carpenter inquired about the requirement of a new resolution when the Borough hires a permanent administrator. Borough Attorney Mr. Betesh replied that a resolution and a council vote are required whenever the Borough hires a new employee to fill the position.

- Councilwoman Carpenter motioned to Appoint Community Development Representatives, seconded by Council President Murphy; all council members present voted yes.

2022-117 the Agreement between the Borough of Bogota and Bogota Fraternal Order of Police Lodge 161 for the Period January 1, 2018, through December 31, 2022 – Council President Murphy and Councilwoman Carpenter inquired about the signing of the contract because the one they had was not signed. The Borough Administrator responded that FOP President Gallipoli signed the contract, and the Borough's Labor Counsel Mr. Wiss reviewed it.

Council President Murphy motioned to accept the Agreement between the Borough of Bogota and Bogota Fraternal Order of Police Lodge 161 for January 1, 2018, through December 31, 2022, seconded by Councilwoman Carpenter; all council members present voted yes.

Approvals:

Councilman Robbins motioned to approve the Minutes from the meeting held on 6/2/2022 and seconded by Councilwoman Carpenter; all council members present voted yes.

- St. Joseph's Church requests Approval for the Raffle in September and waives Borough fees.
 - Council President Murphy motioned to approve St. Joseph's Church's Request for the Raffle in September and waive the fees, seconded by Councilwoman Carpenter; all council members present voted yes.
- Residents requesting a Street closure for a Block Party (154 Walnut Ave to Dunn and Fisher Ave.)
 - Councilman Robbins motioned to approve the Request for a Street closure for a Block Party (154 Walnut Ave to Dunn and Fisher Ave.) from _ to _ was made by Councilman Robbins, seconded by Councilwoman Fede; all council members present voted yes.

2nd Citizen Remarks:

One Five (5) minute time limit per person – Councilwoman Carpenter motioned to go into citizen remarks, seconded by Councilman Robbins; all council members present voted yes.

Mr. Nunez- asked why the Borough approved a Buddy's Place liquor license with the restrictions, and if the bar was still open. He also asked about the status of the litigation.

Councilwoman Carpenter motioned to close the 2nd Citizen Remarks, seconded by Councilwoman Fede. All council members present voted yes.

Borough Attorney Betesh responded to Mr. Nunez that a liquor license renewal takes place annually, even if the bar is closed. The renewal carried forward restrictions that were implemented by the Council years earlier. Since the litigation is pending the Borough could not comment on the status, except that the litigation is still in its early stages.

Reports:

Five (5) minute time limit per Council Member

Mayor, Council Committees, Borough Administrator, Borough Attorney, Acting Clerk

Mayor Kelemen- Spoke about the increase of COVID-19 cases in Bogota and congratulated the class of 2022; he said it was one of the nicest Graduation he has attended. The Mayor wished everyone a Happy and Safe 4th of July.

Councilwoman Granquist- Reported that the three interviewed DPW applicants will start next week. Signs were hung at the DPW HQ that state "NO Dumping". OEM will be in Hackensack during the fireworks on July 4.

Councilman Connors – Reported that the Recreation Department canceled its previous movie night, and the next movie on schedule will be on July 17 and August 20. He thanked the Police Department for all their support with the "Slow down in Our Town" sign. He said the DPW department would hang an electronic sign as well. Councilman Connor motioned to go out for Bid for the Basketball and Tennis Court (Res' # 2022-118),

seconded by Councilwoman Carpenter; all council members present voted yes. Council President Murphy voted no.

Council Present Murphy asked what the cost to the Borough would be to go out for Bid again. Additionally, she asked for some clarification regarding it.

Councilwoman Carpenter -Spoke about the communication with Mr. Flores where he sent the final letter to participate and present the last and best offer to the Borough of Bogota for the Olsen Park Recreation Center. The bid opening for the Recreation Center project will take place July 6 at Borough Hall at 3 pm, and five bidders who agreed to participate will send their Bid on that day. She also mentioned that she is working on a different project to get some grants for the Borough.

Council President Murphy -Library won't have any meetings until September. Regarding the Fire Department's Request for a cost estimate in June for the Engine 3 firehouse .The estimated fee will not exceed \$5,850 and will take two weeks to complete. For the meeting on July 14 or August, David Bilow may be available to explain the context. She said the resolution 2022-111 that was just approved was for the Proposal for surveying services for Fire Engine #3 and The Apollo Building's two properties. Planning and Zoning have not approved any applications at this point.

Councilman Robbins- Reported on the campaign "Slow Down in Our Town" Sign, and metal signs will be posted by the "All Welcome to Bogota" Signs at the entries around the town, "The more visible with can be the better off."

Councilwoman Fede- Reported that she would meet with a possible candidate Alex Rojas as a potential appointee to the Creative Arts Team. She spoke with the CFO regarding the hiring of a new police officer. Planning and Zoning 51 Queen Ann Rd apartment building was approved. The Wendy's and 285 Orchard terrace application was submitted and will be on the Planning and Zoning agenda for the 7/12/2022 meeting. She also provided a summary regarding a meeting with the police department; the auxiliary police will be upcoming into SLEO 1 the department will approve the application. Also reported that the chief wants to present an ordinance like Hackensack regarding the use of smoking marijuana in public. She reported on the meeting with the court administrator Ms. Brothers, and the police Chief Maye regarding the complaints that have been discussed a few times at the council meeting by Mr. Nunez. The court administrator explained the process when a complaint is considered a conflict of interest.

Council President Murphy addressed councilwoman Fede's report by saying that the citizen was inquiring about what happened regarding his complaint, not the complaint process.

Councilwoman Carpenter motioned to advertise for a new police officer (Res 2022-119), second by Councilwoman Fede; all members present voted yes.

Council President Murphy made a motioned to hire a Deputy Clerk Nicolette D'Anna according to our salary ordinance, seconded by Councilman Connors, all members present voted yes. (Res. 2022-120).

Administrator Mr. Hynes –Shared service Meeting- Obligated to defer our last proposed discussion due to the requirement for the DPW Superintendent to serve as a juror for a civil trial. The tree trimming will start in July. Regarding Zoom: the American Recue Plan funds that the Town has available will be used for the meeting recording system. Councilwoman Carpenter explained that those are funds available for the Borough to use.

Resolutions requested by Borough Administrator Mr. Hynes:

Council President Murphy motioned to advertise for a Senior Bus driver, Councilman Connors seconded it, all members present voted yes. (Res. 2022-121).

Council President Murphy motioned to advertise for a company to perform a revaluation, as requested by tax assessor, Councilman Robbins seconded it, all members present voted yes. (Res. 2022-122).

Acting Clerk Flores-Bolivard - Reported sending election certifications to the County on June 21. She is working with the Borough Engineer to update the Town Map with the updated elections districts.

Closed Session: Councilwoman Carpenter motioned to go into closed session, seconded by Council President Murphy; all members present voted yes. Councilwoman Fede obtain from closed session.

Redevelopment: No action was taken.

Councilwoman Carpenter motioned to go into open session, seconded by Council President Murphy; all members present voted yes. Councilwoman Fede abstained from closed session.

Adjournment

Being no further business before the government body, Council President Murphy motioned to adjourn the meeting, seconded by Councilman Robbins; all council members present voted yes. 10:38pm

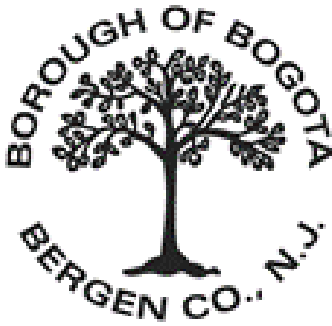

WHEREAS, the Borough of Bogota is desirous of consolidating 9-1-1 Public Safety Access Point (PSAP) service with the County of Bergen for the purpose of sharing of resources and reducing costs; and

WHEREAS, the County of Bergen proposed to provide such 9-1-1 (PSAP) communication services to the Borough for an annual fee of seventy-five cents per resident based upon the 2010 census; and

WHEREAS, the Chief of Police recommends the transfer of the PLAP to the County of Bergen to alleviate the need for departmental system upgrades and assured 9-1-1 (PSAP) communications on a twenty-four-hour, seven day a week basis, including the provision of all medical pre-arrival instructions and translation services; and

WHEREAS, the County of Bergen shall transfer appropriate calls to the Bogota Police Department dispatch desk as necessary and will not provide any dispatching services on behalf of the Borough.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED, by the Mayor and Council of the Borough of Bogota that the Mayor and Borough Clerk be, and hereby are, authorized to execute the Agreement between the Borough of Bogota and County of Bergen authorizing Bergen County communications to provide 9-1-1 (PSAP) communication services to the Borough in the form attached hereto, subject to approval of the Borough Attorney.

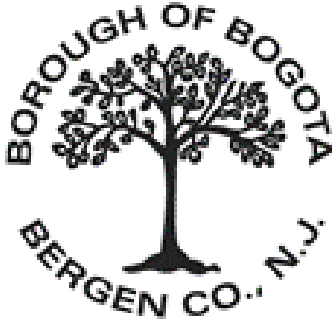

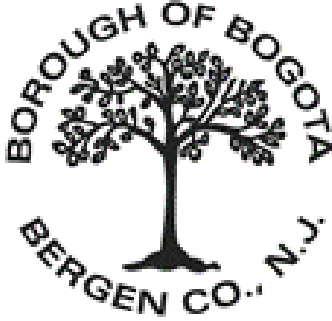

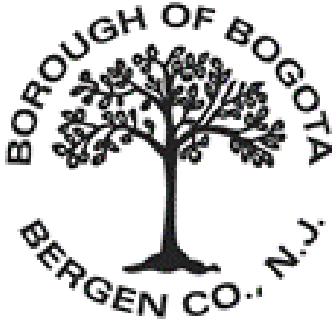
