

Minutes of the Regular Meeting of the Mayor and Council of the Borough of Bogota, held at the Bogota Council Chambers, 375 Larch Avenue, Bogota, NJ, on Thursday, March 5, 2020 at 7:30pm.

Salute to the Flag was led by Councilman Napolitano.

The notice requirements of the Open Public Meetings Law have been satisfied as notice was sent to two newspapers and posted on the Borough Hall bulletin board on December 27, 2019.

<u>Roll Call</u>: Mayor Kelemen and Councilmembers Carpenter, Connors, Fede, Napolitano, and Robbins were present. Councilwoman Murphy was absent. Also attending were Borough Attorney Bossong and Borough Administrator Scarpa.

Motion was made by Councilwoman Carpenter, seconded by Councilman Robbins, to open the meeting to Citizen Remarks. Motion carried.

Frances Garlicki, former Bogota Borough Clerk, explained the many and varied duties of a municipal clerk. She then congratulated the Attorney, Administrator, Mayor and Council for the improvements to the town over the past few years.

Michele Rupar thanked the Borough for the corona virus information that was provided for residents and suggested that the website for the NJ Department of Health be provided as well. She mentioned the phone conference with the County Executive about the Corona virus as well as the phone conference held by Sheila Oliver. She also asked when meetings will be televised.

Motion was made by Councilman Connors, seconded by Councilman Napolitano, to close Citizen Remarks. Motion carried.

The Borough Clerk said that the Bogota Health Officer put the website for the NJ Department of Health on the Bogota website. Borough Administrator Scarpa said that he, the Deputy OEM Coordinator, and the Police Chief listened to the report of the County Executive in Fort Lee and all that was suggested was to report discrimination attacks to the appropriate authorities. Councilman Napolitano said that the township of Teaneck has a phone number on their website for anyone with questions about the virus. Council members Napolitano and Connors agreed with Mrs. Garlicki that the Borough Clerk has an important and busy job. They also agreed that many improvements have been made in town in the past 5 or 6 years. years. Councilwoman Fede said that she will be attending a First Responders Training on Outbreak of Infectious Diseases at the Law and Public Safety Institute along with Bogota Rescue, police, OEM Coordinator, and the

Administrator. Mr. Scarpa said that a man came in and surveyed the Council Chambers and will be putting together a proposal to present at the next Mayor and Council meeting to explain what is needed to record the meetings on television.

<u>Presentation:</u> - Steve Welsh, the grant writer from Bruno Associates gave a summary of the grants he will be pursuing for the Borough this year including grants for a hook and ladder truck, a new firehouse, safe routes to school, road repair, and library renovations.

 Library Director Chelsea Coleman presented a report of the plans and activities for the Bogota Public Library including a local history archive, Mighty Read which begins June 13th where community members read to the children, library cards for all Bogota students, (41% have cards), and youth fine forgiveness. She requested cameras for the reading room, new laptops, new chrome books.

The following Resolution on the Consent Agenda was approved: 20-062 Hiring Derek DeMatteo as Full-Time Police Dispatcher

The following Resolution voted on Separately and approved: PC20-04 Payment of Claims

The following Ordinance was introduced:

#1539 An Ordinance Amending Schedule VIII of Chapter 7-6.2 Creating a Stop Intersection

Approval: - Motion was made by Councilman Napolitano, seconded by Councilman Connors to approve the Minutes of 2/27/2020. Motion carried with only Councilwoman Carpenter voting No because no mention was made of comments made by the Borough Clerk and the Mayor concerning the clerk's salary.

 Motion was made by Councilman Napolitano, seconded by Councilwoman Carpenter, to approve the Tricky Tray and 50/50 to be held at St. Joseph's Church on April 24, 2020 with borough fees waved. Motion carried.

Motion was made by Councilman Napolitano, seconded by Councilman Connors, to open the meeting to Citizen Remarks. Motion carried.

Michele Rupar asked for clarification of the stop sign under the overpass by the River Road West Shore Avenue intersection.

Motion was made by Councilman Connors, seconded by Councilman Robbins, to close Citizen Remarks. Motion carried.

Mr. Scarpa said that the stop sign is not under the overpass. It is around the curb. Councilwoman Carpenter said that the stop sign is across the street in front of the white house next to the driveway. Mr. Scarpa will check to see if all the stop signs in that area have been codified.

Reports: Mayor, Council Committees:

Mayor Kelemen said that he spoke to all the departments and emphasized safety and health as the priority. He explained that whatever is needed to be done by the borough to help control the spread of the virus will be done. He explained how each Borough department, the DPW, the Recreation Center, the OEM, the Police, and the schools are each doing their part to help stop the spread of the virus. He said that he spoke to James Corti, the Deputy Director for Congressman Gottheimer about the terrible condition of the train bridge in the hope that repairs can be made. He reported that he will be reading Dr. Seuss tomorrow at Trinity Lutheran School. He said that he was not invited to Bixby or Steen School this year to read, and he hopes it was an oversight.

Councilwoman Fede thanked Paul Cordero for painting the second floor of the Kennedy building. She reported that the Creative Team had their first meeting on Wednesday and will be meeting on the first Monday. She said that she received all the energy use information from Mr. Hollenbeck of PSE&G for Sustainable Jersey certification. She reported that St. Joseph's will be having a Tricky Tray, and Steen will be having a Tricky Tray, and Crime Stoppers will be having a Tricky Tray. She asked for an understanding of certain lines on the salary ordinance that relate to Battaglia Associates. Mr. Scarpa will look into those line items.

Councilman Robbins said that Teterboro Airport had no noise report for February. The next meeting will be April 22. He reported that there will be a seminar at the end of March explaining how they measure decibel levels which he might attend. He said that the work was completed on Hose 2 Firehouse roof. He reported that the Chiefs said that two generators were mentioned in the last firetruck bond ordinance, and they need the generators to open the firehouse doors in case of a power outage. Mr. Scarpa said that he will look into the bond ordinance. (Mr. Scarpa reminded him that the schools gave the firehouse a generator that was the wrong size for the schools.)

Councilman Napolitano said that the CFO met with the auditor and the administrator. The budget should be introduced at the next meeting. He reported that the Senior Advisory Board had a meeting and complained that the sidewalks adjacent to the high school have been in need of repair for a long time. They reminded him that they need a step put on the van, and they would like the meetings televised. He reported that new tables will be purchased for the Senior Center. He said that the Planning Board discussed meeting with the developers and property owners at a public meeting to discuss what to do with those properties. Suggestions included an over 55 development or a supermarket. He would like to hear what the public would like to see there. He spoke to the County about the potholes on Main Street. The County will be paving Main Street from Hackensack to Teaneck, and River Road will be repaved next year. He said that the road resurfacing bond ordinance this year will be for Cane Street, Fairview Avenue, Walnut Avenue, Dunn Street, Pine Street, and the intersection of Queen Anne Road and Maplewood Avenue. The last phase of Leonia Avenue will be done as well. He said that Preston Avenue will be done next year. He would like an update on the Community Center and the Tennis and Basketball courts at the next meeting.

Councilwoman Carpenter said that the DPW is doing a lot of cleaning up. Code Enforcement Official Barese will provide his quarterly report in April. He said that County's next meeting is March18th. There was a presentation from the Red Cross at the last County meeting about the Coronavirus.

Councilman Connors said that there will be a Board of Education meeting on Tuesday. He said there was a Recreation meeting yesterday. He said that the committee is working on the bylaws. They asked if there will be a Bogota Day this year or just a Fall Festival. He said that Jim Moore asked for

a monthly revenue and expense report. The Easter Egg Hunt will take place on April 4th as well as Opening Day for Little Ferry Baseball. The website is being updated for upcoming events. Football uniforms have not been returned. He said there is no football director at this time. The bylaws will direct each committee member to be responsible for one of the events. A new Easter Bunny is needed.

The Seniors asked for the Steen School choir to perform for them again.

Borough Administrator Scarpa said that new tables will be purchased for the Senior Center. There are 5 or 6 locations in need of sidewalk repair. The Senior bus has been disinfected, and the firehouse roof has been repaired.

The engineer is preparing specs for a turf field and for Pine Street which we have a \$205,000 grant for. The proposal for the basketball courts has been revised, and a DEP report is needed before the project can start. We are getting a price on the archiological study that has to be done for the recycling center. The engineer met with Mr. Scarpa about parking and spoke to the property manager for Wells Fargo, so the project can get started. Electricity and a water supply are needed at Firemen's Park. New Welcome to Bogota signs are being designed. He is looking for a grant for them. The multipurpose bond ordinance was revised to add \$25,000 more for sidewalk repair, \$15,000 for OEM, and \$10,000 for the library. LOSAP information was forwarded to Lincoln Financial. Fixed asset inventory will be started next week.

The Borough Attorney had no report.

The Borough Clerk reported that the health officer said for everyone to stay calm. Wash hands, stay home if ill, drink fluids, and rest. She sent the borough's complaints about the train bridge to Congressman Gottheimer's office.

Mayor Kelemen and Council President want to request inspection reports for the train bridge.

Motion was made by Councilwoman Carpenter, seconded by Councilman Napolitano, to go into closed session. Motion carried at 9:45pm.

When the meeting reconvened at 10:10pm, motion was made by Councilman Napolitano, seconded by Councilman Connors, to Introduce the following Ordinance. Motion carried.: #1538 2020 Amended Salary Ordinance with Clerk's salary increased to \$65,000, Blood Borne Pathogen removed from salary ordinance, and Full Time Assistant Clerk title changed to Deputy Borough Clerk.

Motion was made by Councilwoman Carpenter, seconded by Councilman Robbins, to adjourn the meeting. Motion carried and the meeting adjourned at 10:30pm.

BOROUGH OF BOGOTA ORDINANCE NO. 1539

AN ORDINANCE AMENDING SCHEDULE VIII OF CHAPTER 7-6.2 CREATING A STOP INTERSECTION

WHEREAS, the Borough of Bogota previously adopted Chapter VII entitled "Traffic" establishing regulations regarding parking, travel and other regulations regarding the roadways and streets in the Borough; and

WHEREAS, Officer Kevin Geraghty, in a memorandum to Sgt. Cole and the Chief (annexed hereto), has reviewed certain areas in the Borough and determined that certain stop intersections have been established which need the requisite implementing ordinance; and

WHEREAS, N.J.S.A. 39:4-197 authorizes a municipality to take certain actions regarding public roadways that are wholly within their jurisdiction and deemed municipal roadways without the approval of the Commissioner of Transportation, and

WHEREAS, N.J.S.A. 39:4-141 authorizes a municipality to place "stop" signs as designated.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT ORDAINED, by the Mayor and Council of the Borough of Bogota, Bergen County, New Jersey that Schedule VIII of Chapter 7-6.2 entitled "Stop Intersections" be amended as follows:

SCHEDULE VIII

Orchard Terrace and South Street

STOP sign shall be installed on Orchard Terrace

Linden Avenue and West Grove Street

STOP sign shall be installed on the east side of Linden Ave. travelling north towards West Grove Street

Linden Avenue and West Broad Street

STOP sign shall be installed on West Broad Street travelling east towards Linden Ave.

Linwood Avenue and James Street

STOP sign shall be installed on James St.

Linwood Avenue and Bogert Street

STOP sign shall be installed on Bogert St.

Linwood Avenue and Summit Avenue

STOP sign shall be installed on Summit Ave.

Linwood Avenue and Ridgefield Avenue

STOP sign shall be installed on Ridgefield Ave.

Park Place and Feller Place

STOP sign shall be installed on W. Park Pl.

West Fort Lee Road and Larch Avenue (four-way stop)

STOP signs shall be installed on all approaches to the intersection

BE IT FURTHER ORDAINED, that Schedule VII entitled "Through Streets" be amended as follows:

West Fort Lee Road

a. Between River Road and the West Shore Railroad

West Fort Lee Road

- a. Between River Road and Larch Avenue (unchanged)
- b The intersection of West Fort Lee Road and Larch Avenue is hereby designated as a 4-way stop intersection. Stop signs shall be installed on all approaches to the intersection
- Between Larch Avenue and West Shore Railroad
- c. Between Larch Avenue and West Shore-Railroad
- **BE IT FURTHER ORDAINED**, that a copy of this Ordinance shall be sent to the Borough of Bogota Police Department; and
- **BE IT FURTHER ORDAINED**, that the any and all signage shall be installed to effectuate the purposes of this Ordinance and such signage shall conform to the Manual on Uniform Traffic Control Devices; and
- BE IT FURTHER ORDAINED, that if any section of this Ordinance shall be deemed invalid as a matter of law, such invalidity shall not affect any other portion contained herein; and

BE IT FURTHER ORDAINED, that this Ordinance shall take effect as required by law.
